Since the mid seventies Cathy Leaycraft has been using her camera to create an alternate universe; a universe where size and scale become a mystery.

Leaycraft first manipulated her photographic images with the aid of a Xerox color copy machine, and then moved on to Adobe Photoshop.

Today she uses reflected and refracted light to create a unique

viewpoint before she even snaps the shutter. Her companion on this photographic journey has been a glass sphere.

The title of her presentation is:

Before Light Hits Your Sensor





NOTES FROM NOVEMBER SPEAKERS: VINCENT RICARDEL

Vincent Ricardel talked about **the art of seeing**, or how to previsualize images before pressing the shutter.

He showed portraits of professionals inside, in their environments (for example Dr. Oz in an operating room), studio images and shots outside.

According to him, the key to being a successful photographer is to anticipate a moment. But he also said it takes a lifetime to develop this skill.

For professional shoots, he sets up in about 2 hours, but the shoot itself takes only a few minutes (people are busy!). So it's important to be able to create an atmosphere on the spot, with what he finds on location.

He published a photo book on people with their guitars, including the one above of Kevin Bacon. From his experience, the best photos come either at the very beginning of a shoot, or at the very end. One of his side projects was photographing people at the Salton Sea in southern California.

Ricardel recommended to always carry your camera with you, because you never know when you'll stumble upon a "moment". He also said to look closely at your work, as there may be pictures in pictures that you didn't see before.

I am from Ukraine and joined IPS in April 2014.

In 1992 I visited the United States for the first time and I had a very cheap film point-and-shoot camera with me (made in the USSR).

The pictures I made during that trip turned out to be **surprisingly interesting** (I guess it was due to a combination of several factors, such as expired film, poor quality of the lenses and my surrealistic condition during all the trip).



I can't say that I have a favorite subject. People, landscapes, street, artistic, I photograph anything depending on my mood.

It took me years to learn how not to look at life only through viewfinder. Life is beautiful, and our desire to take a moment with us like a souvenir often ruins the moment itself.

I am inspired by Jan Saudek, Helmut Newton, Henri Bresson, Ansel Adams and many others representing all possible styles of photography.



From this moment, I looked at photography from a different viewpoint. A couple of years later, when a Ukrainian travel magazine **published my photo**s from a trip to Malta, I realized that photography had gained a significant place in my life.








