RECAP - SEPTEMBER SPEAKER: SORA DEVORE

"What do you want your photos to say?" September speaker **Sora DeVore** opened her thoughtful presentation with this evocative question. Regardless of whether we choose to tell our story through a singular image or through a body of work, Sora challenged us to create powerful images that elevate our messages. Through careful observation of our subject's small gestures of hands, feet, shoulders; unvarnished portrayal of lives and honest emotions; and collection of images on a chosen theme. Sora also urged the club members to innovate to find new ways to tell stories in ways that have not yet been seen; to move beyond illustrating and be creative, draw in viewers with feeling and mood; to locate the wacky and the weird. It is remarkable that Sora was able to gain entry into the life of a family not her own and document their most personal moments for the past 18 years. Sora's story - as artist, teacher and devoted mom to an energetic canine explorer - serves as inspiration. Retirement has afforded me time to pursue photography and travel. I've just returned from 10 wonderful days in Paris. Upcoming trips include Big Bend National Park in Texas, Bosque del Apache and White Sands National Monument in New Mexico, and Laos in January. When I'm not traveling, I spend time at the Lewis Ginter Botanical Gardens, Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond and occasionally visit Washington to see friends and visit special exhibits.

For me, photography is simply about capturing memories of places I've visited, a sense of place, color, light and texture. There is so much to learn and I feel still very much a novice. At first I took snapshots, but



now I try to create more interesting images. I also like to try different techniques such as multiple exposures and adding textures. My images are posted on Flickr.com under the pseudonym "Down Under Doll."

Among famous photographers I admire are Henri Carter-Bresson, Lee Friedlander, Sebastião Salgado and Abelardo Morell. I'm also inspired by the talents of the many fine photographers in the IPS.



SHOOTING FALL FOLIAGE

Gorgeous autumn colors - crimsons, golds, and greens - have begun to pop up around our beautiful city. If you're looking for places around the District to catch the rich fall foliage, here are some tips:

- 1. <u>Location</u>: DC might not get the same peeping colors as New England, but there are still beautiful places to shoot around the city or a short day trip away. In DC, try the Cherry Blossoms on the mall, C&O Canal, Franciscan Monastery or some of the trails in Rock Creek Park. For outside of DC, Shenandoah is a great for sweeping mountain views and bold fall colors.
- 2. <u>Timing</u>: Besides the beloved golden hour, try shooting when it is overcast or particularly foggy or misty. This light reduces harsh shadows and the fog can create a mystical, magical feel.
- 3. **Equipment:** Make sure you have the appropriate equipment for getting the shot you want. For example, if you're trying to capture the motion of a running stream or waterfall, you're best off with a tripod to keep balanced during the long exposure. I also recommend using a polarizing filter, which not only reduces exposure but will deepen the color saturation, making the fall leaf colors even more vibrant. A bokeh lens can also be used to create stunning images with fantastic, blurred backdrops. If you're trying to take a close-up of a leaf, mess around with a macro lens!
- 4. **Perspective**: Try to take your shot from a different perspective maybe it's capturing the reflection of leaves in water or it could be using different techniques to create interesting movement. For example, try a panning technique —- switch your shutter speed to around t1/8, zoom in on a part of a tree's foliage (try to frame it with some nice blue sky in the background), and as you hit the shutter, gently pan your camera up and down or from side to side. This slight movement will help give the impression of the leaves moving in the wind.

Inspired? Michele Egan is planning a trip to the Franciscan Monastery, Sat Oct 24, 11am. Let her know if you'd like to join - the gardens are certainly a beautiful place to photograph!













